

Dr. Guylène Proulx is a Senior Researcher in the Fire Research Program at the National Research Council Canada. She has a Ph.D. degree in Architectural Planning from the University of Montreal. Over the last 20 years she has developed a unique expertise in human behaviour studies in emergency situations. Her research involves interviewing survivors after fires and conducting evacuation experiments in buildings. She was selected by NIST to lead the research on the occupant response and evacuation into the World Trade Center Investigation. She is on the Board of Directors of the Society of Fire Protection Engineers and she is also teaching in fire protection engineering at Carleton University and at the Worcester Polytechnic Institute.
